

# WHAT'S IN THE BAG?

*Read all directions!!*

## **DIRECTIONS**

1. Remove the contents of your bag.
2. Inside you will find clues to a crime that was committed. Your job is to use the clues to determine what crime happened.
3. As a team, decide what crime(s) was/were committed, and the general details of the crime(s) (Names of criminals/victims, other people involved, place it happened, etc.)
4. Assign one member of your team to the criminal side.
5. Assign one member of your team to the victim's side.
6. Write a two page paper. Those assigned to the criminal side should type one page to tell the story from the criminal's point of view.
7. Those assigned to the victim's side should type one page to tell the story from the victim's point of view.
8. Staple both pages together, turn into the tray.
9. This will be presented to the class.

## **PAPER DYNAMICS**

Your paper should include:

- 12-point, Times New Roman, double-spaced, 1-inch margins
  - A creative title (no bigger than 14-point font)
  - Crime Committed (5 points)
    - Include the exact crime committed, and the evidence from your bag
    - Example: Aggravated Assault & Kidnapping - Knife, Car, Cell Phone
  - Both team member's names should be included in a header.
  - Write in the first-person. (You are the criminal/victim)
  - One-page Criminal point of view. (20 points)
    - All thoughts leading up to the crime.
    - Any planning that was involved
    - What, if anything, caused the criminal to commit the crime?
    - How did it end? Arrest? Death? Got away? Punishment?
  - One-page Victim point of view. (20 points)
    - Daily activity before the crime/events that lead the victim to the scene of the crime
    - Thoughts and feelings during and after the crime
    - How did it end?
- \*\*This is the minimum to be put in your story. Please expand.\*\***
- Check spelling/grammar.
