# **Understanding Your Guidance and Counseling Program Unleashing its Potential**

#### **College and Career Ready**

The goal of having all students college and career ready is the ultimate responsibility of the K-12 learning community. School administrators deal with increasing complex demands and need to utilize every available resource to achieve this worthy outcome.

College and Career Ready can be defined as the degree to which **academic** (curriculum & performance) and **interpersonal** (advising, counseling and support) experiences prepare a student to make informed decisions, transition successfully and meet the demands of college or the work force.

A fully implemented comprehensive guidance and counseling program (CGCP) is one of the most effective programs available to help schools cultivate student readiness to learn, remove barriers to learning and achieve their ultimate potential. Abundant research exists that documents that more fully implemented programs create positive results for students and schools. It is imperative that administrators understand the dynamics of this program in order to use it more effectively.

## **Program Design**

Missouri's comprehensive guidance and counseling program is designed to address the academic, personal/social, and career needs of all students. The four program components of guidance curriculum, individual student planning, responsive services, and system support are unique, yet mutually supportive in addressing the Guidance Grade Level Expectations, student needs, and the on-going mission of the school and district.
